Find Yourself at Home

I'm ready to buy a home, where do I look for houses?

Once you have been pre-approved for a home loan it is time to select and start working with a Realtor. Realtors are critical to helping you narrow down your property search. They can also give you advice about neighborhoods, schools and property taxes. If you are not ready to start working with a Realtor directly you can search for homes online. One helpful resource is the Regional Multiple Listing Service online. Visit www.rmls.com to search by property type, number of rooms, nearby schools, neighborhoods, square footage, zip codes and more. Remember to limit your search by home price so you are shopping for homes in your affordable price range.

Are there any organizations in Portland that sell affordable homes?

Many of PDC's community partners have homes for sale, and they are an excellent place to search for affordable properties. HOST Development, Inc. (www.hostdevelopment.com) has affordable homes for sale in northeast and southeast Portland. HOST and PDC have a partnered on a subdivision in SE Portland called Raymond Park. PDC is able to offer special financial assistance to lower the cost of buying these homes, and HOST also has funds to help pay the closing costs. ROSE Community Development (www.rosecdc.org) has their Woodmere Condominiums for sale in southeast Portland. A three-bedroom unit sells for \$169,900! The Housing Authority of Portland (www.hapdx.org/haphomesales) currently has a large inventory of affordable homes for sale as well. As you begin your search for affordable homes, remember that many of these programs have income limitations. Contact HAP, HOST and ROSE today for more information.

PDC has special home loan programs in specific Urban Renewal Areas. How do I find homes in eligible URAs?

Start by looking at our URA maps on our web site at www.pdc.us/nhp-ura. When doing your property search, try to limit your search to schools or zip codes that overlay the URA. Once you find a potential home, use Portland Maps online to confirm that it is in a URA (www.portlandmaps.com). Enter the property address and click "search." Next click on "development" in the toolbar at the top of the page. If an Urban Renewal Area is listed for your property, you know it is in one of our areas. Then give us a call at 503.823.3400 to see if you qualify for our special home loan programs.

2008 HOUSING & ECONOMIC RECOVERY ACT

The following summary of the 2008 bill will help you better understand how it may affect you:

- The Act works to help homeowners refinance their homes to avoid foreclosure by providing lenders with government-issued mortgage insurance. Homeowners can access the benefits of the Act by talking to an FHA-approved lender (find a lender at fha.gov).
- To curb future mortgage problems and predatory lending, the Act also creates a nationwide licensing and registration system to set firm standards for brokers and lenders to follow.
- First-time homebuyers can benefit from a \$7500 federal tax credit that works as a no-interest loan (paid back over 15 years). It should be noted that this tax credit is not compatible with an Oregon Bond Loan.
- Homeowners and homebuyers may also benefit from an additional tax deduction of up to \$1000.
